

Nuggets from Rabbi Fenves's D'var Torah

Chaye Sarah focuses on Abraham and Isaac's reactions to Sarah's death. Although Isaac never speaks, his relationship with Rebecca at the end of the story tells us a lot about the depth of his grief in just one verse.

Nuggets from Rabbinic Student Alex Loundy's D'var Torah

To be a seer is not to be omniscient. It is to receive a destination with no roadmap and start traveling. This is the condition we find ourselves in. We are lost. We have no map or guide. All we have is a vision of the future and a mandate to 7 - to go. Amidst this time of extraordinary chaos and confusion, it is tempting to wait for calmer weather. But we cannot wait. We cannot let forces outside our control constrain us from doing what is still in our power. The belief that we are powerless is the very thing which must drive us to action. This paradox was explained by civil rights activist and theologian Abraham Joshua Heschel:

The Torah, we are told, is both concealed and revealed, and so is the nature of all reality. All things are both known and unknown, plain and enigmatic, transparent and impenetrable. 'Hidden are the things that we see, we do not know what we see.' The world is both open and concealed, a matter of fact and mystery. We know and do not know- that is our condition.
