

Excerpts from Vayishlach Parsha by Rabbinic Student Alex Loundy



"See Me"

As a young student, I discovered the two most anxiety-inducing words in existence: "See me." Appended to an essay or email, these two little words created an entire universe of worry. Versions of a conversation would begin to unfold in my head. I'd imagine arguments, defenses, emotional outbursts. Ten versions of the meeting would play out in my head before any real interaction, and all of them foretold disaster.

Perhaps that is why I feel a special empathy for Jacob, who deals with this same challenge in this week's parshah. As parashat Vayishlach opens, Jacob's past is catching up to him. Quite literally, in the form of his brother Esau and his tribe of warriors. Though it has been many years, Jacob still remembers that they parted on bad terms. He had stolen Esau's birthright, and then fled when Esau threatened to kill him. Now, he was terrified. Yet, ever the pragmatist, he split his followers into two camps to ensure that one would survive when Esau's inevitable attack struck the other.

. . . .

That night, as Jacob prepares for the coming battle, he is blindsided by a figure. As Jacob helps move his family across a river, a man attacks him and they begin to wrestle. This contest lasts all night, and even though the man dislocates Jacob's hip, he refuses to let go until the man agrees to bless him. The man then names him Yisrael, one who wrestles with God. Israel.

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
The newly named Yisrael looks up and sees his brother approaching. He divides his family members between his wives. Then he prepares for the dreaded meeting with his brother. And what does Esau do when he sees his younger brother, who screwed him all those years ago and ran away? "Esau ran to meet him; he embraced him, flung himself upon his neck, and kissed him. And they wept."

Jacob expected his brother to kill him. He could not have been more wrong. His attitude, all of his preparations, had been misguided. He had thought his fight would be with Esau, but instead the real fight had caught him completely off-guard.

. . . .

"Man plans, God laughs." We descendants of Jacob, how many times have we formed the most meticulous plan, only to have it blow up in our faces? And when our plans fail and God laughs at us, how often do we feel like we are the butt of some great cosmic joke?

Yet parashat Vayishlach offers us a different truth, daring us to remember that sometimes our plans fall apart and the result turns out better than we could have hoped. Vayishlach reminds us that it is not too late to reconcile with our brother Esau, and that potentially hard meetings between people are not problems to solve. They are an embrace, and it is we who choose if that embrace will be a wrestling match or a reunion.

# What's the Board Up To?

The board met on Dec. 10, 2024 and heard reports about the Rabbinic search from Elissa. The search committee is now in the stage of conducting first round Zoom interviews with candidates. Applicants come from the CCAR Small Congregations Collaborative, the CCAR Rabbinic Search, and the American Conference of Cantors Cantorial Search. Charles reported on the state of the roof

which has sustained hail damage. Andrew discussed the progress of the children of the religious school. The Board thanked Rabbi Fenves for serving as Interim Rabbi for the past 18 months. Rabbi Fenves thanked Shaareth Israel for the warmly supportive and well attended last service and noted that many members participate in the life of our congregation - but that the bench could be deeper. The Board thanked Andrew Friedman for his long service as Vice-President. Andrew will leave the Board but will serve on the Finance Committee (Charles, Jonathan, Leon, Stephanie, Sandra Sabatini). Beth Cobb steps up as Vice President this January. Congregation Spring Board meetings are scheduled for Jan. 29, Feb. 18, Mar. 26, Apr. 30, and May. 28.
