Dear CSI Family,

I dare say that talking about money is somewhat taboo around Jews. The stereotypes about Jews and money probably contributes to the discomfort. While I want to say that everyone feels awkward about money, this is not always true. When we visited our friends at the Second Baptist Church, collecting money during services is normal, as it is the case in most, if not all, other churches.

Talking about money is awkward. We can all be very sensitive to the subject. We want to be valued for who we are and not how much we give. For this reason, membership pledges are highly confidential in our community. We want everyone to know that we value every member of our community because every family who contributes -- financially, in time or skills, and in participation in Shabbat services and Torah study -- is making a declaration about their values.

There are so many competing and worthy causes: youth group, interfaith efforts, arts and culture, food bank, homeless shelters, health-care clinics, refugees, victims of sexual abuse, animal shelters, and so many more. When a family states that they are committed to their Jewish community with a pledge, we feel honored.

Sometimes, a gift to the temple stems from a desire to belong to the community, other times, to guarantee certain membership benefits (such as a place in the religious school). Other possible motivations come from the desire to make sure that there will always be a temple in Lubbock. All these reasons recognize that the temple needs money to stay open; the temple has financial needs that need to be met.

While it's true that the temple needs financial resources to function, I wonder how our relationship to the temple might change if we reframed for ourselves our reasons for giving. In Exodus we read, "Tell the Israelites to bring Me gifts; you shall accept gifts for Me from every person whose heart is so moved.... And let them make Me a sanctuary that I may dwell among them (b'tocham)." (Ex. 25:2, 8) Two things draw our attention in these verses: 1) The giving is voluntary, 2) The cause to which the Israelites are voluntarily giving their resources is a dwelling place for God. A feeling of obligation and requirement goes a long way towards convincing people of the value of contributing to temple resources. Along with that sense of obligation, might it be possible to also think of ourselves as giving from our hearts, voluntarily? (I think so.) As for building a dwelling place for God, the more activities, the more programming, the more we come together to lift each other up, the more we feel God's presence among us.

There is no such thing as showing gratitude too often. I hope each
